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DESCRIPTION

The 1946 Luscombe 8A Silvaire is a highly attractive classic aircraft for sale with authentic post-war American aviation character. Light, elegant, efficient, and visually distinctive, the Luscombe 8A represents an important chapter in the development of the American vintage light aircraft market.

Designed by Donald A. Luscombe, the Model 8 series became known for its clean high-wing aircraft profile, side-by-side seating, conventional tailwheel aircraft layout, and notably advanced all-metal construction for its era. The Luscombe 8 family first flew in 1937 and became one of the recognizable light aircraft lines of the late 1930s and post-war period.

The Luscombe 8A Silvaire was developed during a period when general aviation was becoming more refined, efficient, and accessible. Unlike many light aircraft of its time, the Luscombe emphasized clean lines, lightweight metal construction, and efficient performance from modest horsepower.

The Model 8A variant is commonly associated with the Continental A-65 engine , producing approximately 65 hp . AOPA lists the 8A with a Continental A-65-8 engine, fixed-pitch propeller, two-seat configuration, 1,260 lb normal-category gross weight, and 510 lb maximum useful load.

This combination makes the 1946 Luscombe 8A Silvaire especially appealing to buyers who value classic flying qualities without unnecessary complexity.

Technical Features & Flying Character

The Luscombe 8A is a single-engine piston aircraft with a fixed high wing, two-seat side-by-side cabin, and conventional landing gear. Its design is simple, efficient, and highly representative of classic American light aircraft thinking.

Plane & Pilot lists the 1946 Luscombe 8A as a two-seat aircraft powered by a 65 hp Continental A65 engine , with a cruise speed of around 78 knots , useful load of 510 lb , and maximum range of 520 nautical miles .

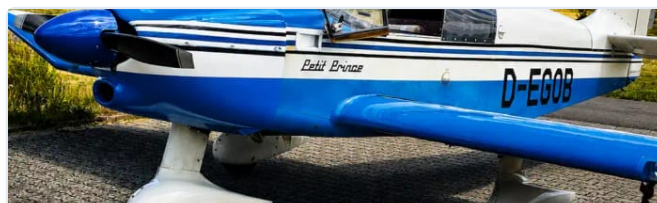
