Post-War American Aviation Heritage

The Taylorcraft BC-12D was introduced in 1945 as Taylorcraft returned to the civilian market after producing military gliders and the L-2 observation aircraft during World War II. By 1946, more than 4,000 BC-12D aircraft had reportedly been produced, making it one of the company's most important post-war models.

The aircraft competed directly with other light airplanes in the 65-horsepower class. Its efficient wing and streamlined cabin allowed it to achieve noticeably stronger cruise performance than several comparable aircraft of its era.

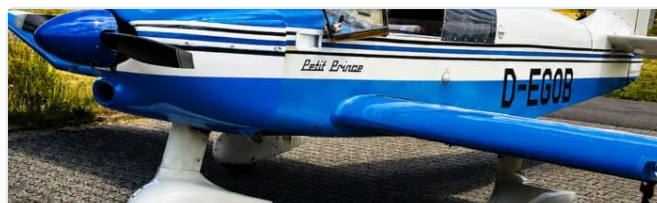
