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DESCRIPTION

The 1947 Auster J/1 Autocrat is a distinctive classic British aircraft for sale , combining post-war aviation heritage, practical three-seat accommodation, and the unmistakable character of a traditional high-wing touring aircraft.

Developed from the wartime Auster observation-aircraft family, the Auster J/1 Autocrat was created for the emerging civilian aviation market after the Second World War. From Military Heritage to Civilian Touring

The Auster J/1 Autocrat was developed as a civilian touring derivative of the Auster Mk V observation aircraft. The design retained the robust high-wing layout associated with wartime Austers while introducing a wider, more practical cabin and simplified civilian equipment.

The result was a capable post-war touring aircraft intended for private owners, aero clubs, charter operators, photography, and other light commercial duties. The first production aircraft was delivered in December 1945, and the model remained in production into the early 1950s.

This heritage gives the 1947 Auster J/1 Autocrat a compelling identity: it is not simply a vintage recreational aircraft, but part of the transition from wartime observation flying to post-war private aviation.

Technical Features and Flying Character

The original Auster J/1 Autocrat is powered by a Blackburn Cirrus Minor II, a four-cylinder, air-cooled inverted inline piston engine producing approximately 100 hp. Standard performance figures include a cruising speed of around 100 mph, a maximum speed of approximately 120 mph, and a standard range of around 320 miles.

Its shape is immediately identifiable as a classic British touring aircraft. Compared with smaller trainers, the Autocrat has a more substantial cabin and a purposeful profile derived from the Auster observation-aircraft family.

Inside, the Auster J/1 offers accommodation for a pilot, a front-seat passenger, and a third occupant seated sideways behind the front seats. 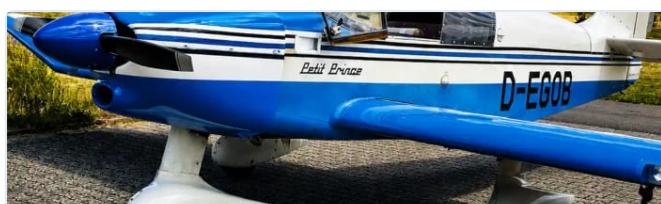
