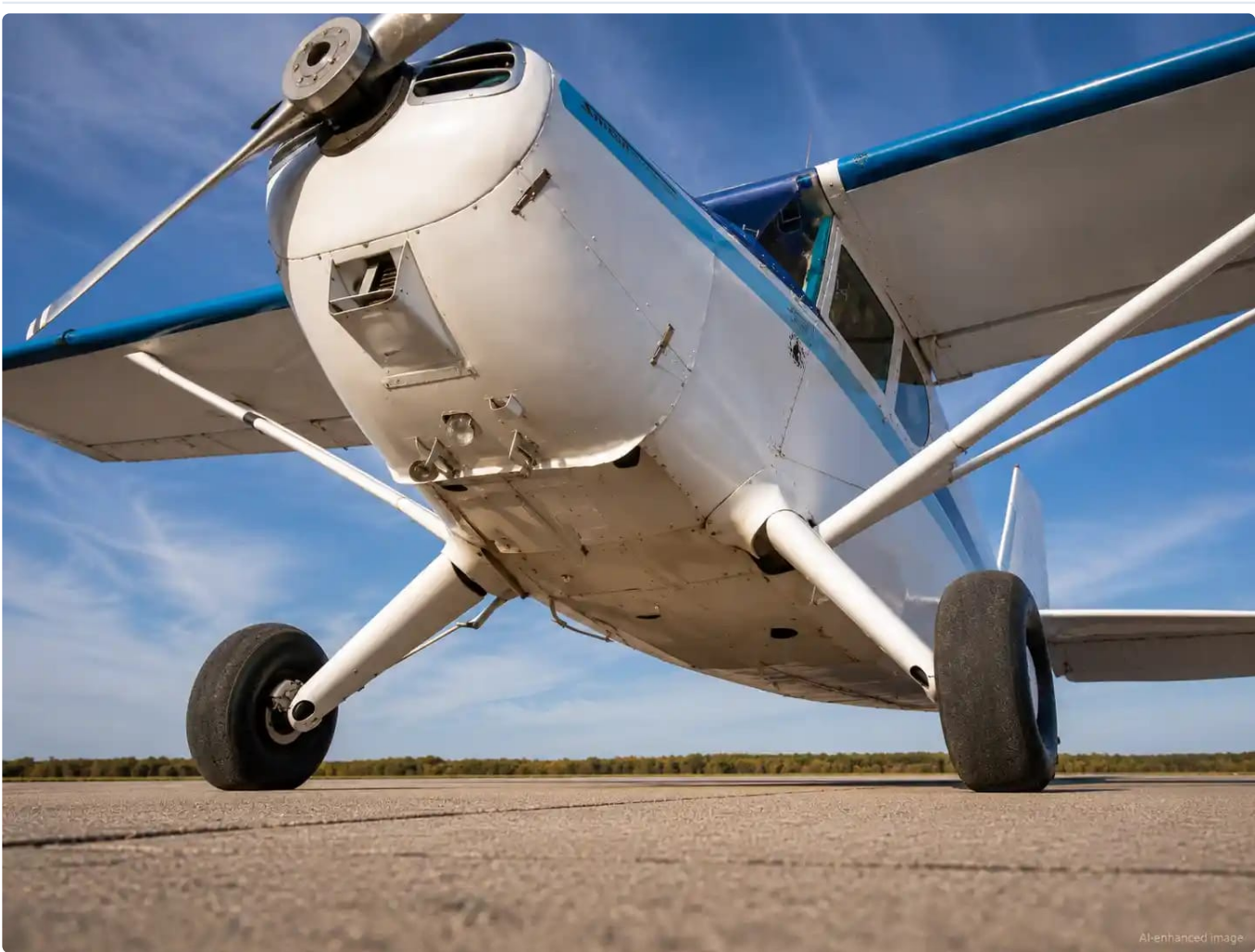

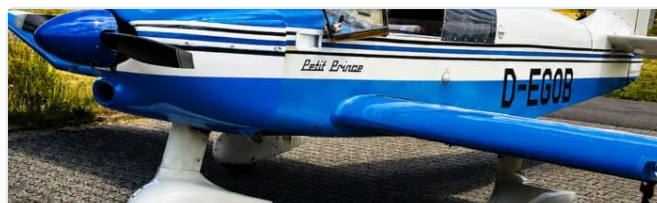


Rare UTVA AERO 3
