DESCRIPTION

The 2011 Apollo Fox is a lightweight, high-wing STOL ultralight/light sport aircraft designed for simplicity, versatility, and strong short-field performance. Built with an emphasis on low operating costs and excellent low-speed handling, the Apollo Fox is widely used for recreational flying, flight training, and backcountry operations where runway availability is limited.

Its standout feature is its foldable wing system, allowing for easy storage and transport, making it one of the more practical STOL-capable light aircraft for private owners operating in remote or space-limited environments.

Powerplant, Systems & Technical Highlights

This configuration is powered by the widely used Rotax 912 series, known for reliability, efficiency, and strong performance in light sport aviation.

The 100 HP output from the Rotax 912 ULS provides a strong balance of climb performance and fuel efficiency, making it ideal for STOL operations, short grass strips, and light touring missions. Its low fuel consumption and smooth operation make it one of the most popular engines in the light sport category.

Airframe & Exterior Design

The Apollo Fox features a lightweight, purpose-driven airframe designed for low-speed efficiency and practical field operations.

Key structural features include:

- High-wing, strut-braced configuration for stability and lift
- Fabric-covered aluminum and steel tube structure
- Foldable wings for transport and hangar/storage flexibility
- Lightweight fixed landing gear optimized for rough and grass strips
- Large canopy/windows for excellent pilot visibility

The aircraft's design prioritizes simplicity and utility, making it highly capable in short-field environments while remaining easy to operate and maintain.

Cockpit & Interior

The cockpit of the Apollo Fox is straightforward and functional, designed to maximize situational awareness and pilot control.

- Side-by-side seating for two occupants
- Basic analog flight instruments (glass cockpit optional in upgraded builds)
- VFR-focused avionics layout with optional GPS, radio, and transponder
- Wide canopy design providing excellent visibility in all directions
- Minimalist interior focused on weight efficiency and practicality

The layout supports both training environments and recreational flying where simplicity and clarity are preferred over automation.

Performance Characteristics

With the Rotax 912 ULS engine, the Apollo Fox delivers efficient performance with strong STOL capability.

Its overall simplicity makes it one of the more accessible STOL-capable aircraft in its class.

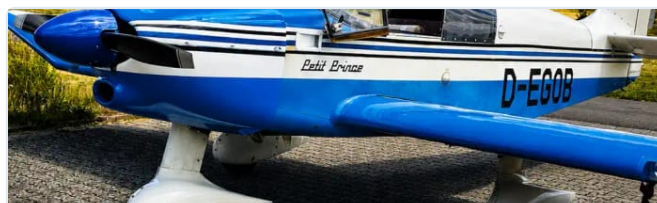
