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DESCRIPTION

The de Havilland DH.82 Tiger Moth is one of the most iconic classic training aircraft ever built, a two-seat, open-cockpit biplane that helped define basic flight training for generations of pilots.

First flown in 1931, the de Havilland DH.82 Tiger Moth became closely associated with Royal Air Force primary training and later found a second life in civilian flying, vintage aviation clubs, private collections, and open-cockpit experience flights. 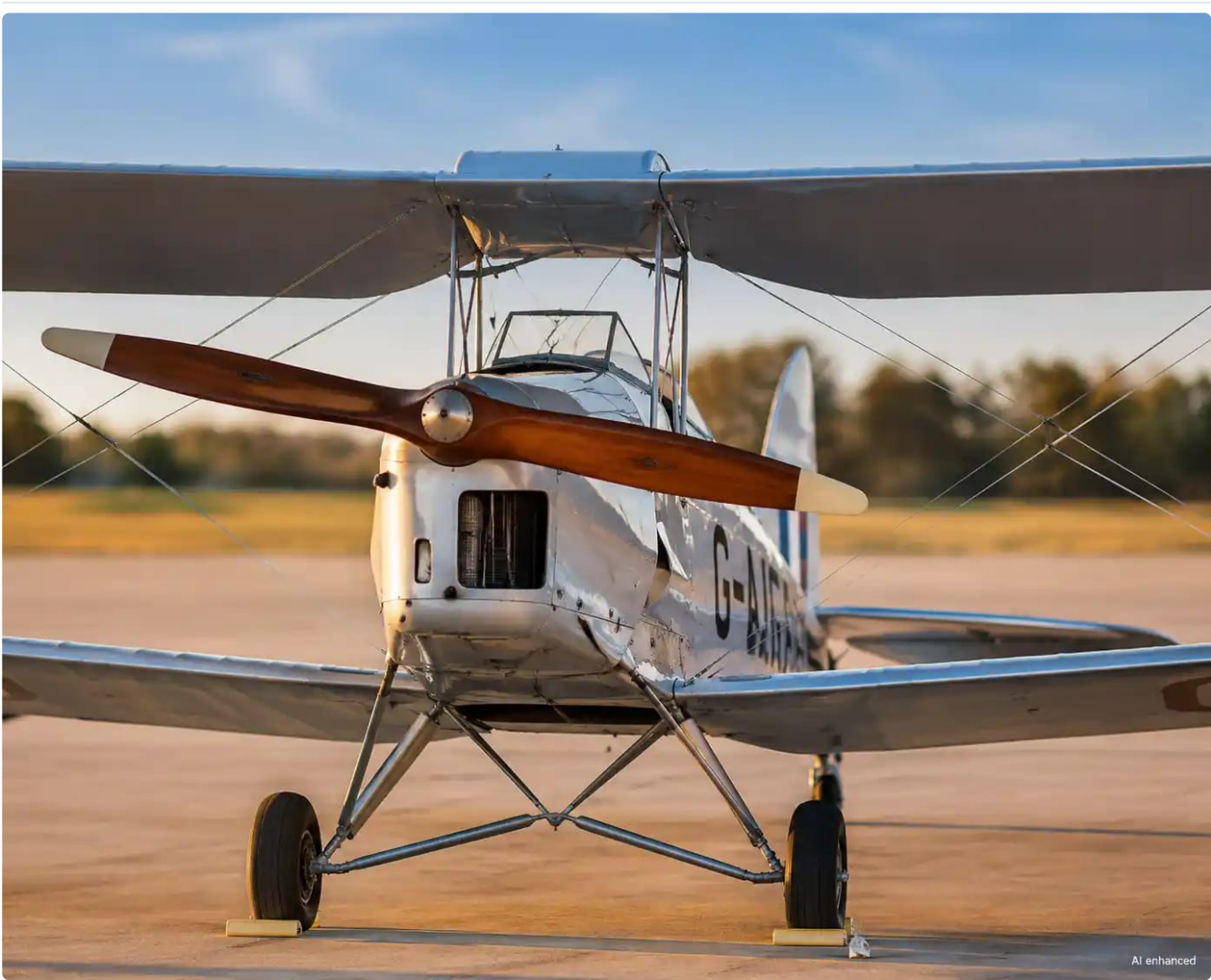
