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DESCRIPTION

The Fairchild UC-61 Forwarder is a classic four-seat, single-engine liaison and light transport aircraft with deep roots in 1930s American general aviation and Second World War utility service.

Developed from the Fairchild Model 24, the Fairchild UC-61 Forwarder was adopted by the United States Army Air Corps and also served with the Royal Air Force. It combines a high-wing cabin layout, conventional tailwheel landing gear, mixed wood-and-fabric construction, and the warm, tactile character of pre-war aviation design .

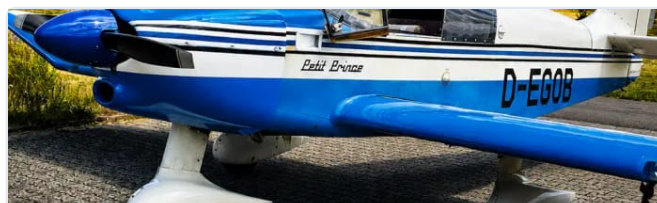
