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DESCRIPTION

The Mikoyan-Gurevich MiG-21UM is one of the most recognizable two-seat jet trainers of the Cold War era — a supersonic, delta-wing aircraft created to prepare pilots for one of the most widely used fighter platforms in aviation history. We are now presenting the MiG-21UM for sale located in Hungary , more precisely in the city of Szeged. This is the only fighter jet in Hungary at the moment .

Unlike a basic training aircraft, the Mikoyan-Gurevich MiG-21UM was built around the experience of high-speed military jet operations in the Soviet Union in 1986 and was introduced into service with the Hungarian Air Force that same year. With tandem seating, slim fuselage, sharply swept delta wing, nose intake, and afterburning turbojet performance. It is a training aircraft with the soul, sound, and silhouette of a frontline interceptor . Quite a few of today's Gripen pilots have even flown this aircraft. It is quite rare in the world for a fighter aircraft that has been taken out of service to be appreciated and stored in a dignified manner.

The Mikoyan-Gurevich MiG-21UM is powered by an R-13-F300 afterburning turbojet engine , commonly listed with approximately 6,490 kgf of thrust . The engine is working and a so-called "cold start" was performed in 2024. That gives the aircraft the raw character expected from a supersonic Soviet jet: fast acceleration, high climb performance, compact dimensions, and the unmistakable energy of an aircraft designed for serious military conversion training .

Technically, the Mikoyan-Gurevich MiG-21UM was designed to train pilots in the systems, speeds, sight picture, and handling environment associated with advanced MiG-21 operations. Its two-seat cockpit makes it especially interesting for collectors and museums because it tells the training story behind the fighter legend.

Exterior & Cockpit

The Mikoyan-Gurevich MiG-21UM has an exterior that is instantly recognizable: a slim fuselage, sharp delta wing, nose intake, central shock cone, tall fin, and long forward probe. It looks fast even when parked, with a compact, almost missile-like profile that perfectly reflects the engineering priorities of its era.

A noteworthy preservation detail is that the Mikoyan-Gurevich MiG-21UM has deliberately retained its older paintwork. This was done to avoid unnecessary sanding or surface treatment that could unintentionally damage the aircraft's exterior skin. For a historic jet of this type, that preservation-first approach can be an important advantage, especially where future airworthiness, restoration planning, and originality are part of the buyer's evaluation.

The two-seat canopy is one of the defining visual features of the Mikoyan-Gurevich MiG-21UM. Compared with single-seat combat versions, the extended cockpit line gives this aircraft a distinctive trainer identity while preserving the aggressive outline that made the MiG-21 famous worldwide.

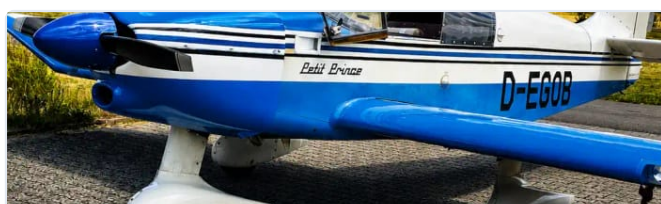
