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DESCRIPTION

The Pitts S-1S Special represents one of the purest and most iconic single-seat aerobatic biplanes ever created. Designed by Curtis Pitts, the Pitts Special family first flew in 1944 and became a benchmark for aerobatic aircraft design, especially during the 1960s and 1970s, when Pitts aircraft dominated competition aerobatics.

Compact, powerful, and intensely responsive, the Pitts S-1S Special was built for pilots who want a direct connection between hand, stick, airframe, and sky. This is not an aircraft designed for relaxed touring or passive flying. It is a purpose-built aerobatic machine with a legendary reputation for precision, agility, and unmistakable character.

For collectors, aerobatic pilots, and aviation enthusiasts, the Pitts S-1S Special stands out because it combines:

Powerplant, Systems & Technical Highlights

At the heart of the Pitts S-1S Special is the Lycoming AEIO-360-B4A / IO-360-B4A engine, a four-cylinder, horizontally opposed piston engine producing approximately 180 hp. This engine gives the aircraft the punch, throttle response, and reliability expected from a serious aerobatic platform.

The exterior design is not about luxury or unnecessary size. It is about strength, lightness, and control authority. The fabric-covered structure, compact wing area, and tight proportions give the Pitts S-1S Special its unmistakable competition character.

Inside, the cockpit is focused entirely on the pilot. The single-seat layout creates an immersive aerobatic environment where visibility, control feel, and aircraft feedback matter more than comfort features. The pilot does not sit in the Pitts S-1S Special as a passenger; the pilot wears the aircraft like a precision instrument.

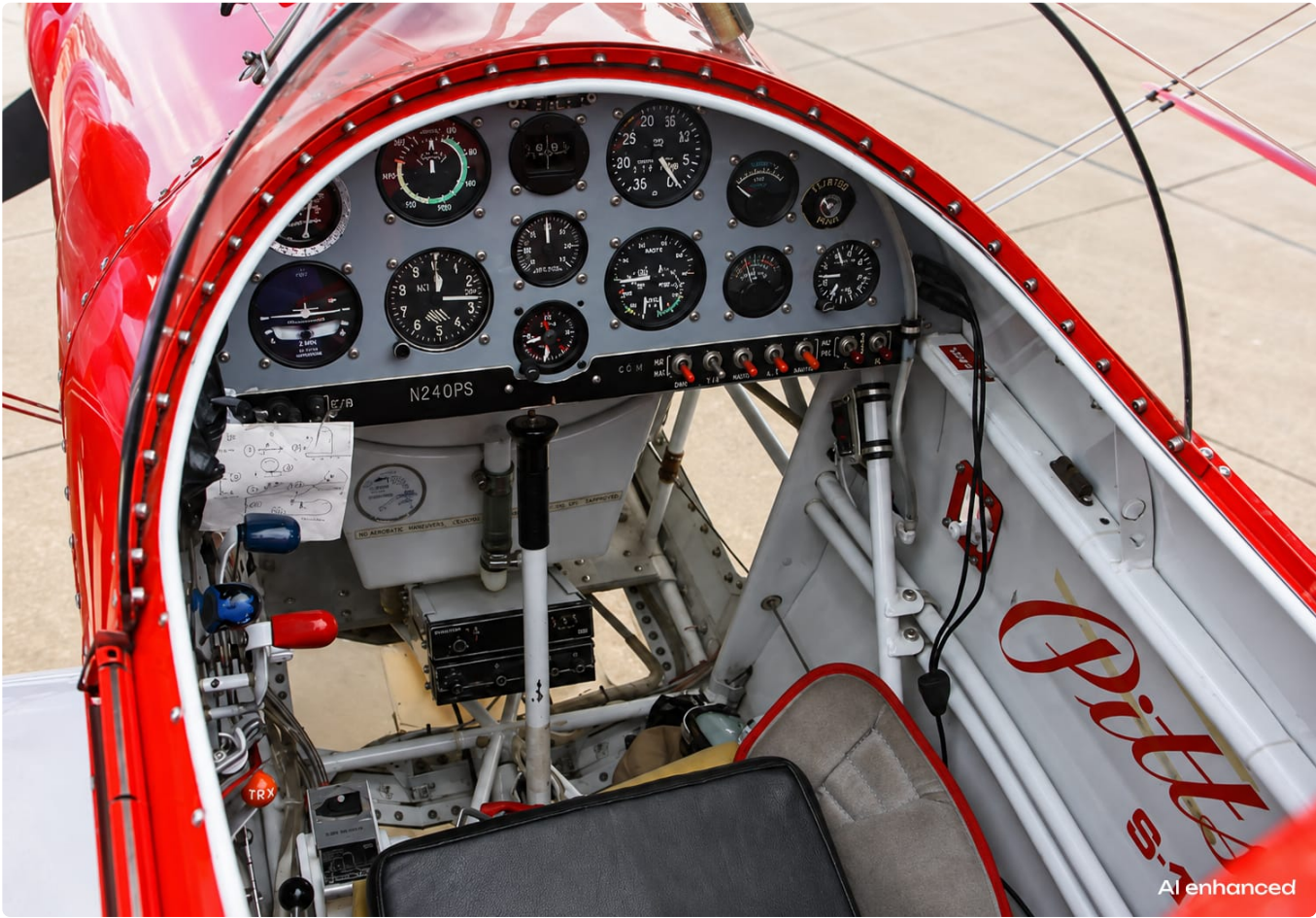

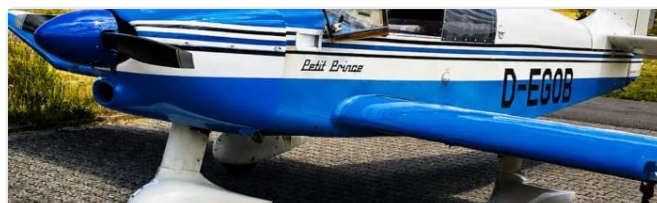
