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DESCRIPTION

The Rockwell Commander 114 represents one of the most refined expressions of classic American single-engine, four-seat touring aircraft design. Originally developed by North American Rockwell (Rockwell International) and introduced in the 1970s, the Commander 114 was built around the idea of combining comfort, stability, and solid cross-country performance in a clean, efficient airframe. It quickly earned a reputation for its smooth handling, strong structural feel, and exceptionally comfortable cabin—making it a premium alternative in the high-performance piston single category.

As a low-wing, four-seat aircraft, the Commander 114 sits in the cross-country touring segment, designed for private owners, business travel, and personal transportation. Unlike more utilitarian trainers or light sport aircraft, the 114 emphasizes cabin comfort, stability in cruise, and a “solid aircraft” feel in flight. Its metal construction and wide cabin give it a more substantial presence compared to many lighter general aviation aircraft of its era.

Powerplant, Systems & Technical Highlights

At the heart of the Rockwell Commander 114 is the Lycoming IO-540 series engine, a six-cylinder, fuel-injected, horizontally opposed piston engine known for durability and smooth power delivery. In the Commander 114, it is typically tuned to produce around 260 horsepower, giving the aircraft strong cruise performance and confident climb characteristics, especially at higher weights.

The Commander 114 is defined less by extreme performance and more by its balanced handling and comfortable cruise characteristics. It is known for stable IFR platforms, predictable control response, and a cabin that feels more spacious and refined than many contemporaries in its class. Its combination of a strong IO-540 engine and clean low-wing design gives it reliable cross-country capability without feeling over-stressed or demanding.

Exterior & Cockpit

The Rockwell Commander 114 carries one of the most recognizable profiles in general aviation: a sleek low-wing design, distinctive semi-T-tail in early variants, and a wide-stance tricycle landing gear that gives it a confident ground presence. Its airframe is fully metal, contributing to its solid structural feel both on the ground and in flight. Compared with many light aircraft, the Commander has a noticeably “heavier” and more planted aesthetic.

The cockpit is one of its strongest features, offering a noticeably wide cabin with excellent shoulder room for four occupants. Large windows provide strong visibility, and the seating position is comfortable for long-distance travel. Later avionics upgrades often include Garmin or Aspen glass cockpit retrofits, but many examples still operate with traditional analog IFR panels, reflecting its long service history in private ownership.

Inside, the Commander 114 feels more like a small touring cabin than a basic light aircraft. The controls are smooth and well-harmonized, and the aircraft’s stability makes it especially well suited for cross-country IFR operations. It is not designed to feel agile or sporty—it is designed to feel steady, comfortable, and confidence-inspiring over long distances.

The Perfect Airplane For

The Rockwell Commander 114 is ideal for pilots who want a comfortable, stable, and capable four-seat cross-country aircraft with strong cruise performance and a solid build quality. It is especially suited for private owners, business travelers, instrument-rated pilots, and individuals upgrading from entry-level trainers into a more refined touring aircraft.

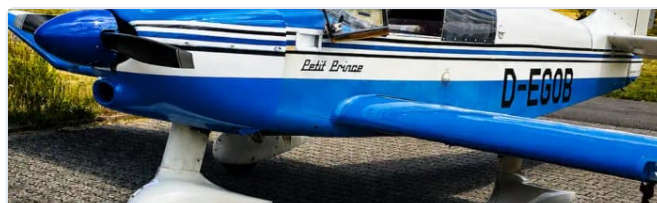
