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DESCRIPTION

The Piper PA-34 220T Seneca V represents the most mature and refined expression of Piper's long-running Seneca twin-engine family. Designed as a light twin for private ownership, business travel, multi-engine training, and practical cross-country flying, the Seneca has built its reputation around cabin flexibility, turbocharged performance, and the reassurance of twin-engine operation. The Seneca V was certified on December 11, 1996 and entered production as a 1997 model year aircraft, bringing aerodynamic, cockpit, and engine improvements to the proven PA-34 platform.

As a PA-34-220T, the Seneca V is positioned as a capable piston twin that bridges the gap between training aircraft and more complex cabin-class twins. It offers six-seat practicality, turbocharged high-altitude capability, and a comfortable cabin layout, making it attractive for pilots and owners who want serious touring ability without stepping into turbine aircraft.

Powerplant, Systems & Technical Highlights

At the heart of the Piper PA-34 220T Seneca V are two Continental TSIO-360-RB turbocharged six-cylinder piston engines. These engines produce 220 hp each and give the aircraft its 220T designation, while the turbocharging supports stronger performance at altitude compared with normally aspirated piston twins. The Seneca V also introduced an improved engine variant with intercooling, helping distinguish it from earlier Seneca generations.

The Seneca V's appeal lies in the combination of turbocharged twin-engine performance, retractable landing gear, useful cabin capacity, and manageable piston ownership. It is capable enough for serious IFR touring, yet still approachable for pilots stepping up from high-performance singles or training-focused twins.

Exterior & Cockpit

The Piper Seneca V carries the classic Seneca profile: a low-wing airframe, twin engine nacelles, retractable landing gear, and a practical cabin shape designed around real passenger use. Compared with many smaller piston twins, the Seneca's cabin is one of its strongest qualities, offering space for up to six occupants and a layout suited to both family travel and business missions.

The Seneca V also received redesigned engine cowlings for improved performance, while several cockpit switches were moved from the main panel to the headliner, giving the cockpit a cleaner and more organized layout. Later aircraft equipped with Garmin G1000 NXi avionics offer a modern glass-cockpit environment, supporting IFR operations, navigation awareness, and reduced pilot workload.

Inside, the Seneca V is not just a technical step up from single-engine aircraft; it is a more serious traveling machine. Its cabin, twin-engine layout, and turbocharged altitude capability give it the feel of a proper cross-country aircraft, while still retaining the directness and familiarity of a piston-powered Piper.

The Piper PA-34 220T Seneca V is ideal for pilots and owners seeking a capable, comfortable, and practical piston twin with turbocharged performance. It is especially well suited for private owners, business travelers, flight schools offering advanced multi-engine training, IFR pilots, and families who want a real six-seat aircraft with the added confidence of two engines.

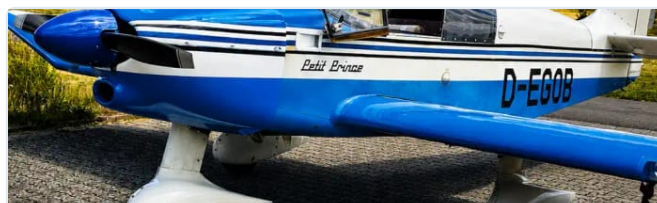
